4) Communications Committee

Purpose Statement:

To serve God by providing a comprehensive communications ministry using all available methods that will tell the story of the church to inspire and inform members and invite the greater community into the FPC family.

Ministry Task Description:

- 1. Act as leaders in communication for the church staff, congregation and other interested parties (mission partners, other churches, etc.).
- 2. Identify emerging opportunities that will improve church communications (such as multimedia use in classrooms).
- 3. Be a support mechanism for the director of communications that will provide direction, advice and constructive feedback as needed.
- 4. With the director of communications, assist in planning and implementation of major efforts such as the website, new media (audio/video streaming, podcasting), and a marketing and communications plan.

5) Congregational Care Committee

Purpose Statement:

Congregational Care ministers to the needs of our church community by providing care of mind, body and spirit, nurturing our congregation's efforts to live the second greatest commandment to love one another.

Ministry Task Descriptions:

CARE MINISTRIES

Stephen Ministry – Well-trained, committed Stephen Ministers establish one-on-one relationships with members going through life's tough transitions: empty nest, loss of job,

retirement, bereavement, divorce, extended illness, etc. This is a ministry of Christian care giving, not counseling. Stephen Ministers listen first and foremost. Then they accompany their care receiver on the journey toward wholeness, being present to them and praying with them.

my faith FAMILY is a church-based model of foster care that surrounds foster families with a community of caring – volunteers who embrace the call to care for foster parents so that they can more effectively care for orphaned children.

Care Team Network – Neighborhood Care Teams, provide a chance for neighbors to get to know one another, and to respond in love to one another's needs. Care Teams are created by zip code and meet in one another's homes once a month for fellowship and to coordinate care of their neighbors who need assistance. This is most evident when a member, or their family member, is hospitalized, is chronically ill, or is bereaved. Care Teams provide meals, transportation, errand running, cards and visits, or whatever else might be needed.

Bereavement Meals – Members with the gifts of compassion and hospitality provide meals and receptions for bereaved families who are not part of a small group, such as a circle or church school class.

Housesitters – A group of faithful servants are available to stay in the home of a bereaved family during memorial/funeral services. They are there to answer the phone, receive gifts of flowers and food, and provide a presence at a vulnerable time.

Confidential Prayer Line – Dedicated "*pray-ers*" pray for our church and its members daily. Many of those who pray are homebound members or members who find it difficult to be physically active in ministry otherwise. We also run a "Joys and Concerns" column in the Penn Street to keep the membership informed of fellow members' struggles.

Nursery Support Team – "You Rock" volunteers and "rockers" rotate into the nursery or toddler room each Sunday during the 9 or 11 o'clock service to hold, rock, read and play with the many babies and toddlers that are there now.

Shuttle Service – Volunteers drive the shuttle between Trinity Terrace and church parking lots at all three worship spaces during two shifts every Sunday morning. They also provide this service at special worship events.

Men's Visitation - Dedicated men of the church visit homebound men once a month who can no longer participate in church activities. They are assigned a different homebound man each month and can calendar their visits to meet their personal schedules.

***PW Fellowship Visitation**—Each circle takes 2 honorary members, women who are now homebound and unable to participate in church activities. Women from each circle visit their honorary members each month for a period of 2 years, keeping them connected to the larger church.

Card Ministry- This group sends out cards to maintain contact with our homebound members who can no longer attend worship.

Flower Ministry – Committed individuals make arrangements from the flowers on the communion table and take them to our hospitalized members along with a prayer for their recovery.

Muffin Ministry – Once a month a group meets to send cards, package muffins and deliver them to families and individuals that are in special need of a tangible gift of love.

Prayer Shawl Ministry- A group of women gather once a month for prayer, fellowship, and to dedicate the shawls and afghans for members of our church in need of comfort and healing. Accomplished needle workers and novices alike are welcomed.

Support Groups – We offer on-going support groups that minister to members as need arises. Past offerings have included groups on grief, divorce, and care giving.

*This ministry is carried out through Presbyterian Women, rather than Congregational Care, but is listed here as it is an integral part of our church's comprehensive caring ministries.

6) Evangelism Committee

Purpose Statement:

The Evangelism Committee exists to share the good news of the gospel by demonstrating God's love and hospitality to all and to encourage others to do the same.

Ministry Task Description:

7) Fellowship Committee

Purpose Statement:

The Fellowship Committee promotes joyful events that encourage intergenerational bonding, connection and community within (and beyond) our congregation, as we model hospitality to the world.

8) Finance Committee

Purpose Statement:

The purpose of the Finance Committee is to provide the Session and the congregational membership with appropriate information pertaining to the financial condition of First Presbyterian Church of Fort Worth.

Mission Statement:

Members of the Finance Committee of First Presbyterian Church are called into service as compassionate stewards of the financial resources of the church. We will prayerfully consider, evaluate and respond to financial needs to further the mission of the church in accordance with the policies and procedures approved by Session and contained in the Book of Order.

The Finance Committee will:

• Be mindful that congregation members offer money gifts to God through the Church;

• Construct an annual budget of the Church's finances and present it to Session for approval;

- Monitor the budget throughout the fiscal year to ensure that the Church's revenue and expenses are within the parameters approved by Session and take appropriate action when they are not;
- Monitor the security of all funds including operating funds, memorial funds, savings and any others that may be added from time to time;
- Be responsible for overseeing and providing offering counters and banking procedures;
- Report the financial condition of the Church to Session on a monthly basis;
- Provide monthly reporting to standing committees regarding their program budget allocation.

9) Mission Outreach Committee

Purpose Statement:

The Mission Outreach Committee serves to receive and share Christ's compassion and justice in a broken world by inspirational stewardship of the time, talents, and treasure of the FPC Congregation locally and throughout the world.
