

PASTORS' LETTER



Dear friends,

Lent is my favorite liturgical season. I imagine for some the themes of repentance, humility, and mortality seem heavy and dark. And I admit, they can be. They also, for me, invite deep reflection on my humanity and what it means to

understand my humanity as a child of God. Henri Nouwen's *Life of the Beloved* is a spiritual classic that I return to each Lent. His words always call forth for me deep reflection. The following passage has done that for me often:

"Our brokenness is always lived and experienced as highly personal, intimate, and unique. I am deeply convinced that each human being suffers in a way no other human being suffers... Our brokenness is truly ours. Nobody else's. Our brokenness is as unique as our chosenness and our blessedness... Yes, fearsome as it may sound, as the Beloved ones, we are called to claim our unique brokenness, just as we have to claim our unique chosenness and our unique blessedness." (pp. 87-88)

I have always thought of Lent as such an honest season. Honest about who I am - who we are - and honest about the depth of God's love for us in Jesus Christ. As we journey through Lent and approach Holy Week, may you experience God's claim, God's blessing, and God's presence with you in your brokenness - as well as in your joy. You are Beloved. We are Beloved. God holds us all in the palm of God's hand. Today, tomorrow, and always. What a gift. Honestly.

Sanctuary Renovation Info Meeting March 4

FPC's Session has approved in principle a project to improve the Sanctuary's public address system and to renovate the Sanctuary, likely to begin late this Spring. The Session has provided funding for the project from resources generously provided in the past and set aside to fund projects like this one. No solicitations will be made. We are so blessed! The design calls for:

- New paint
- Spacing the pews farther apart to allow for easier movement
- Adding a lift into the chancel to welcome those with mobility challenges into worship leadership
- Bringing the chancel and the Lord's Table forward, and closer to worshipers

STEPHEN MINISTRY: SUSTAINING CARE

Stephen Ministry is doing a new thing. FPC has a long tradition of providing high-quality, Christ-centered care to those who are going through tough times. However, we recently developed a new program that recognizes the value of companionship during times that are not marked by particular difficulty or crisis.

We call it Sustaining Care. It's a ministry that encourages care receivers to tell their stories. We have received much positive feedback on this new approach which suggests that it fills a definite need within our congregation.

All Stephen Ministers receive comprehensive specialized training before beginning a caring relationship. Those in the Sustaining Care program have received additional preparation as active listeners. They meet regularly with care receivers and walk alongside them for the long term.

Stephen Ministry will continue to provide both the traditional model of caring during difficult times and the new Sustaining Care program, according to need. This Child Here will now partner with European Operation of the Lumos Foundation (EOLF), which was started by famous author and advocate J.K. Rowling to deinstitutionalize children globally. While EOLF will take on the legal and political and structural changes, This Child Here will prepare youth from orphanages and families in the Odessa region for life together. Robert shares, "We are part of something historical. They have deinstitutionalized Bulgaria, Moldova and the Czech Republic. Now it's Ukraine."
